Marie-Vincent

Description: Marie-Vincent kiosks will present a range of tools, training courses, and programs for teaching prevention to various groups of children and adolescents. These include:

- The Lantern program
- The Compass program
- The Pathway project
- The Heads or Tails project
- The Halftime project
- The web game Delicate Spots
- The sexual exploitation intervention kit
- The APP program
- The social-judicial component



Association des Haltes-Garderies communautaires du Québec (AHGCQ) (community daycare centres association)

Description: The AHGCQ kiosk will promote their key tools, which are designed to support early childhood education staff. While developed for the association's drop-in daycare members, the tools are also useful for all types of childcare settings. The following materials will be found at the kiosk:

- "Growing Up in a Community Drop-In Daycare" educational program
- Observation in a community daycare centre
- Observation, planning, organizational and reflection tools
- Development of a community daycare centre
- Democratic intervention
- Directory of intervention strategies
- Co-parenting reality game
- Routines and transitions poster
- And more.



CAVAC Montérégie

Description: This kiosk will provide a general overview of CAVAC services, and more specifically its PTE (Programme témoins enfants/children's witness program). If you have a client, close relative or minor student called upon to testify in criminal court, they can count on our support! With the PTE, the aim of witness preparation is to:

- Minimize stress for children
- Contribute to a good-quality testimony (clearly describing their recall of events)

Materials at the kiosk:

- PTE program, along with a poster explaining the 5 intervention components)
- Image of a courtroom
- Select visual tools, such as the PTE platform and CAVAC app
- Select tools used in the PTE program (Hibou Koury owl & student characters, 10 skills, questionnaire quizzes, gumball machine, cool coco, etc.)
- Various pamphlets



Community Health and Social Services Network (CHSSN)

Descriptif: The kiosk will present information on agencies in the CHSSN network, research tools for information about children and parents, and tools to communicate with and support English-speaking families.



Centre de Prévention et d'Intervention pour les victimes d'agression sexuelle (CPIVAS) (prevention of sexual violence and treatment for victims)

Descriptif: CPIVAS presents its range of services for children and adolescents, which includes individual treatment, Clique sur toi! prevention programs for primary and high school students, and the web app for the same. Attendees will also discover their new digital tools created for grade 1 teachers, and training courses on sexual violence available for one and all.



Fédération québécoise des organismes communautaires Famille (family community organizations)

Description: The kiosk will offer information on the federation and its members, as well as three flyers/tools:

- 1. Supporting and guiding co-parents Handout: This tool is intended for workers, board members and volunteers who wish to learn about the co-parenting approach and how to develop an awareness of it in their day-to-day prevention and support practices with families. This evolving tool is meant to be informative and reflection-based and is rooted in the foundations of Autonomous Community Action Practices (ACAF).
- 2.Les Arts, support and guidance tool for parents for consultation only: This tool illustrates the benefits of the arts in support strategies and guidance for parents who use family community organizations (OCF) services.
- 3. Innovative practices for educational success for consultation only: A tool intended for family community organizations (OCF) with the aim of being a reference on the importance of OCF practices in educational success. In collaboration with Laval-based La Maison des enfants le Dauphin, a family community organization.



Naître et grandir

Description: This organization will distribute material that professionals can order from the website to support their work with children.

The items to be distributed are:

- Size scales
- Posters about emotions
- Copies of Naître et grandir magazine
- The Chaminou books
- La routine de Chaminou board
- Memory games



City of Montréal Police Department (SPVM)

Description: The SES takes a trust-based approach to help victims of sexual exploitation break free. The Survivors program addresses an urgent need for prevention and awareness, particularly among youth and Indigenous victims. Indigenous survivors have joined the team to provide culturally adapted support.

Objectives:

- Raise awareness about prostitution, sexual exploitation, and human trafficking.
- Help victims recognize pimps' tactics and control mechanisms.
- Provide an additional resource for professionals and institutions.

Three components:

- Training for law enforcement
- Training for professionals
- Direct intervention with victims and vulnerable individuals



Société québécoise de la déficience intellectuelle (SQDI)

Description: Come meet the QIDS team and explore their tools designed to further the understanding of intellectual disabilities (ID). Here, you will find the brochure Words Matter!, which underscores the importance of using the right terms when talking about an intellectual disability. You can also delve deeper with a tailored training course for interested stakeholders; the aim is to grow the understanding of IDs and how affected persons live with them, while offering concrete tools for more appropriate interactions. Lastly, awareness-raising videos highlight how persons with an ID cope with challenges.



Éditions-Émotion

Descriptif: Éditions Émotion creates educational tools to enrich interpersonal relations and promote personal growth for children and adults alike through self-knowledge, leading to a clearer understanding of the ways (both good and bad) they interact with others and thus derive greater fulfilment from their relationships.

Tools created for the community will be presented: Maslow's hierarchy of needs/pyramid and wooden caps describing basic needs, a booklet for learning Atikamekw words for body parts, a prevention booklet, a talking stick game for good and bad feelings, etc.



Conseil de la Nation Atikamekw

Description: Community-developed tools will be presented, including the Maslow/Teepee Pyramid and wooden capsules illustrating basic needs, a small book titled "I Learn Atikamekw: Body Parts", a prevention booklet, a talking stick game on positive and negative emotions, and more.



Community-based social pediatrics to empower children and adolescents

Description: Community-based social pediatrics is an integrated social medicine model that combines the strengths of medicine, social sciences and the law with a view to reducing or eliminating the sources of toxic stressors that affect the development and well-being of vulnerable young people living in difficult environments. Social pediatrics is practiced in 47 centres throughout Québec, with services delivered to more than 11,000 children and youths each year. Many of these youngsters are struggling to overcome sexual violence in their pasts; social pediatrics is there to support them, in cooperation with academic, community and institutional stakeholders.

Learn how community-based pediatrics helps screen for high-risk situations and sexual abuse disclosures and creates secure environments for recovering children and families. You will also learn more about research done in community-based social pediatrics and about community-based vocational training programs that help create conditions conducive to children's empowerment and agency in recognizing and defending their fundamental rights.



Le regroupement des Auberges du coeur - Des outils pour l'autonomie

Descriptif: This kiosk will feature promotional material about the Outils pour l'autonomie mobile app, along with a few brochures about the Regroupement des Auberges du Cœur.



GRIS-Montréal

Descriptif: GRIS-Montréal is a non-profit organization established in 1994. Its mission is to promote deeper knowledge of sexual and gender diversity and to facilitate the integration of LGBTQ+ individuals in society. GRIS operates with a large number of volunteers, who mainly lead workshops in a variety of settings on demystifying sexual and gender diversity through testimonials. At the GRIS-Montréal kiosk, volunteers will present the organization and play a few games.
