A Word from the President and the General Manager

Protecting and helping more and more young people

This year, the youngest members of our population have been at the heart of Québecers' concerns. Certain tragic events come to mind, such as the story of the girl from Granby. As a community, we have dared to dream of a world free of mistreatment and sexual violence against children and adolescents. Important commissions and consultations have been implemented by the Government of Québec, including the Special Commission on the Rights of the Child and Youth Protection and the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors. The Marie-Vincent Foundation has participated in a number of these initiatives throughout the year. Parliamentarians, MNAs and professionals from various backgrounds have all contributed to the work to improve services for our youth and to ensure that a social safety net be implemented to better protect them.

We are very happy to see that, together, Québecers want to build a community that protects our young people. To this end, in 2019-2020 Marie-Vincent continued its efforts to provide its sexual violence prevention and treatment services for young victims.

Preventing sexual violence

On May 1, 2019, we officially launched our Lantern Program to prevent sexual violence against young children. It is designed for preschool-aged children and the adults in their lives. The program includes sex education and the promotion of egalitarian relationships. Since its release, training has taken place in Québec childcare settings, and the program is being gradually rolled out. The Atikamekw Awacic version was launched on November 13, 2019, in La Tuque.

A new Prevention section has been added to our website, marie-vincent.org. Content and tools for parents and professionals are available online for free. Our three books for young children, *You as Me*, *Milo's Boundaries* and *Marvin Disappeared*, are also being sold in Québec bookstores. Following the launch, a campaign to prevent sexual violence against young children was released for the general public through numerous large media sources.

In the past year, we have further improved our services for the prevention of sexual violence against adolescents.

Our online sexual violence prevention project now has a new peer training component with adolescents giving online sexual violence awareness workshops in grades 5 through 8. Four videos designed for teens and preteens and discussion guidelines for parents have been created. All this material is available in our website's Prevention section. We have also been working on an interactive online sexual violence prevention game for adolescents which will be released in the 2020-2021 year. We are very excited to share this project!

Through the Marie-Vincent Foundation's voice, May has become sexual violence awareness and prevention month in Québec. MNA Catherine Fournier had this motion adopted unanimously by the National Assembly in May 2019.

Helping young victims and their parents

In recent years, we have seen a considerable increase in the demand for services for young victims of sexual violence and children who exhibit sexual behaviour problems. To better help all these victims and their substantial needs, the Marie-Vincent Foundation wishes to open a second service center outside of Montréal.

In the past year, we conducted a study on regional needs. This analysis, combined with various conditions for success, indicated a need for our services among youth and families in Montérégie. Partners from the region have been mobilized and involved in the project. We are currently seeking the necessary funding to open a new point of service that will provide services to evaluate needs and specialized treatment to child and adolescent victims of sexual violence, as well as children aged 12 and under with sexual behaviour problems. Psychosocial support will also be available to non-offending adolescents and parents. The goal, as in Montréal, is to place the child at the heart of services by mobilizing regional partners and offering all the services that families need under one roof: police, medical, psychosocial and socio-legal services.

The 2019-2020 year was once again filled with encouraging projects and developments for Marie-Vincent. Unfortunately, it ended on a less bright note, as the COVID-19 pandemic forced us to cancel the final benefit event of the year, Marvin on the Rock. We can expect that once this period of confinement has passed there will be an increase in disclosures of sexual violence and reports to authorities. We will need to be ready for the increased demand for services. The need to resume our services among youths and families and to meet the growing demand will be even greater.

For my part, I am honoured to be the new president of the Marie-Vincent Foundation since June of last year. Jean-Pierre and I would like to warmly thank all the phenomenal employees of the Marie-Vincent Foundation, our partners and our generous donors, who help us to build a world free of sexual violence.

We support numerous partners from different sectors throughout the province.

We mobilize the victims, their parents, governmental and financial partners, and those who work with young victims of sexual violence, to strengthen the cause and eliminate sexual violence.

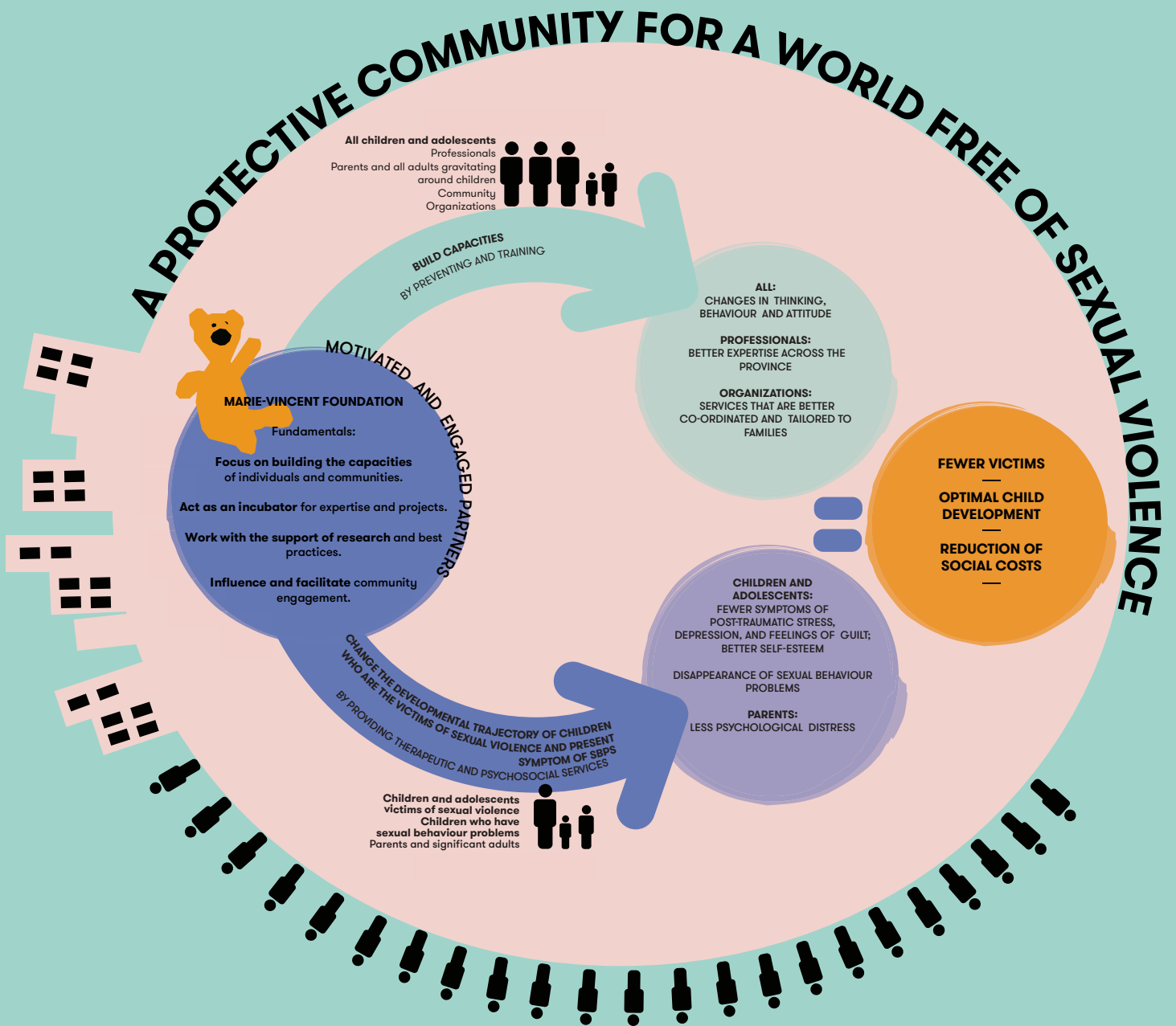
The Foundation collaborates with dedicated partners to:

- change the developmental trajectory of child and adolescent victims of sexual violence and those with problematic sexual behaviour by providing therapeutic and psychosocial services.

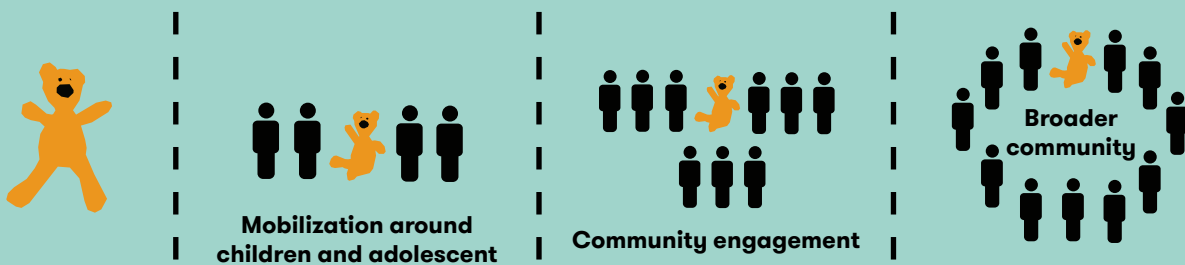
The Foundation has developed a Social Transformation Diagram to present the impacts it seeks to have in the community.

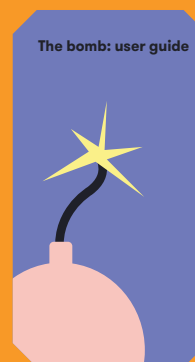
A new partnership with the SPHÈRES project

On October, 2019, the Marie-Vincent Foundation became an official partner of the SPHÈRES project. This project supports Montréal youths aged 12 to 24 in a situation of sexual exploitation. The project is a collaboration between institutional and community partners to help these young people break free from sexual exploitation through concerted action.

Through this partnership, the Marie-Vincent team offers psychotherapy services to young victims of sexual exploitation and participates in consultation meetings with the project's partners: the CIUSSS Centre-Sud-de-l'Île-de-Montréal, the Montréal West Island IUHSSC, En Marge 12-17, L'Anonyme and the SPVM's Les Survivantes program.

New tools to support parents

To keep offering quality services that meet families' needs, the Marie-Vincent team has developed new tools to support parents of young sexual violence victims. When a child discloses a case of sexual violence, the family often feels like a bomb has dropped in the home. The situation seems surreal and incomprehensible to parents. These new tools are designed to help strengthen their adaptation skills and restore their hope and self-confidence. They also help to neutralize the state of shock and guide the parents through the steps of recovery.



Prevention and training

Marie-Vincent Foundation prevents sexual violence against young children and adolescents by training professionals from various disciplines and implementing programs thereby strengthening the capacities of communities to protect their youth.



For preschool-aged children

We contribute to the prevention of sexual violence against young children with the Lantern Program. The program integrates sex education, promotes egalitarian relationships, and is designed for preschool-aged children and the adults in their lives.

After being implemented in 50 pilot locations, the Lantern Program was officially launched on May 1, 2019. The program implementation was evaluated by the Marie-Vincent Interuniversity Research Chair, and the results were conclusive: the program was well received both by early childhood educators and by the children themselves! Since May, the program has been rolling out across Québec. New program facilitators were trained and have begun passing on the knowledge primarily to home childcare providers.

The Atikamekw Awacic version of the program was released on November 13, 2019, in La Tuque, in close collaboration with the Atikamekw Nation council. The program is now available for Atikamekw communities, and its implementation was also evaluated in collaboration with the Université du Québec à Chicoutimi. The results were very positive and highlighted the adaptability of the various tools. We are currently working on bringing the program to the Innu community of Natashquan.

A new Prevention section has been added to our website, marie-vincent.org. Content and tools for parents and professionals are provided for free online. Our three books for young children, *You as Me*, *Milo's Boundaries* and *Marvin Disappeared*, are also being sold in Québec bookstores.

For children

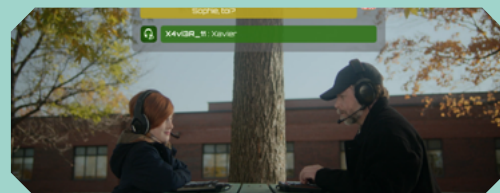
We support elementary schools by providing them with training on how to respond to disclosures of sexual assault and sexual behaviour problems among 6- to 12-year-olds. In the past year, through the collaboration of the Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur, we improved our offering by making it available to all elementary school staff in Québec. This training and support offering is provided for free. The goal is to train as many elementary school teachers and professionals as possible in the province's 72 school boards.

In 2019-2020, we also expanded our online sexual violence prevention project to include fifth and sixth grade students. Awareness workshops have been facilitated by secondary school ambassadors for fifth and sixth grade classes in Montérégie and Laval.

For adolescents

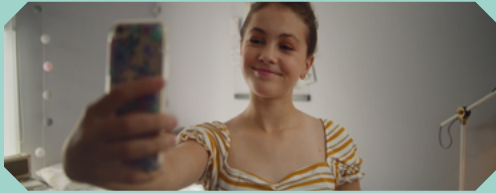
We are working towards the prevention of online sexual violence among adolescents. In 2019-2020, we enhanced our services by adding a peer-facilitated prevention project with youths presenting online sexual violence awareness workshops in fifth and sixth grade and secondary I and II classes. Four videos and discussion guides were created to assist these young facilitators in their workshops and also to guide parents. These tools can be found on the website of the Marie-Vincent Foundation.

Video for grade 5 students



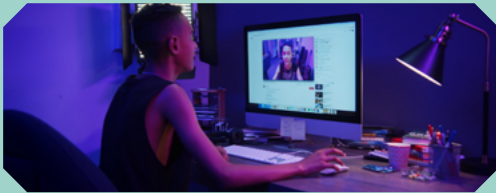

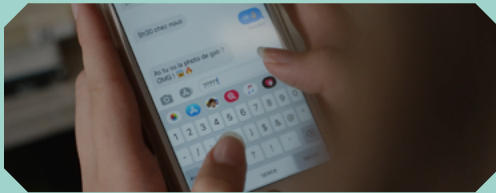

Over the past year, we have also been working on an interactive online sexual violence prevention game for adolescents. With storylines featuring the player as a hero, various themes are addressed: first sexual relations, sharing of intimate photos, pornography, sexual violence, disclosure of sexual assault and sexual exploitation. Players become aware of these various problems through the game. Complementary resources and help are also provided.

The game can also be used by teachers, as it addresses principles included in the sex education program. It will be released during the 2020-2021 year.

For professionals

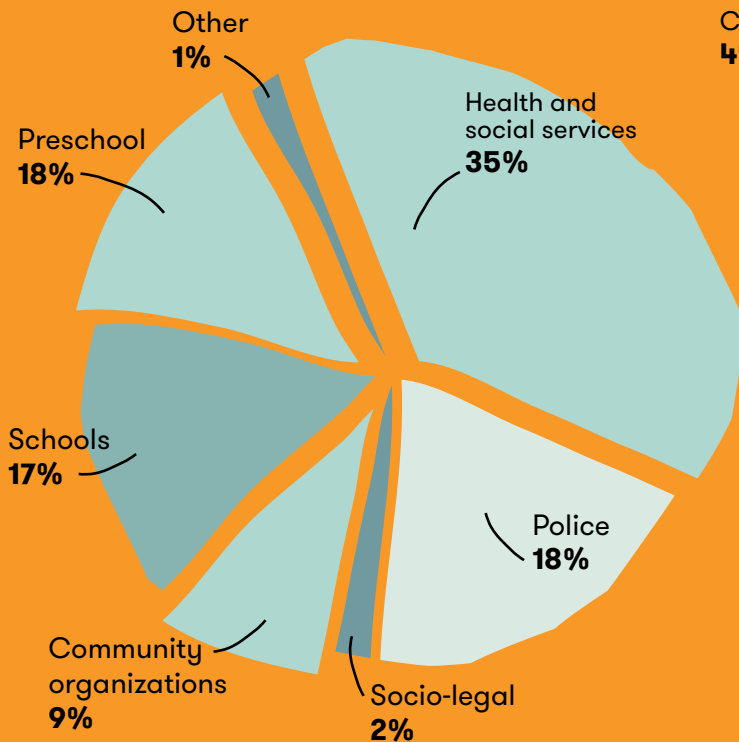

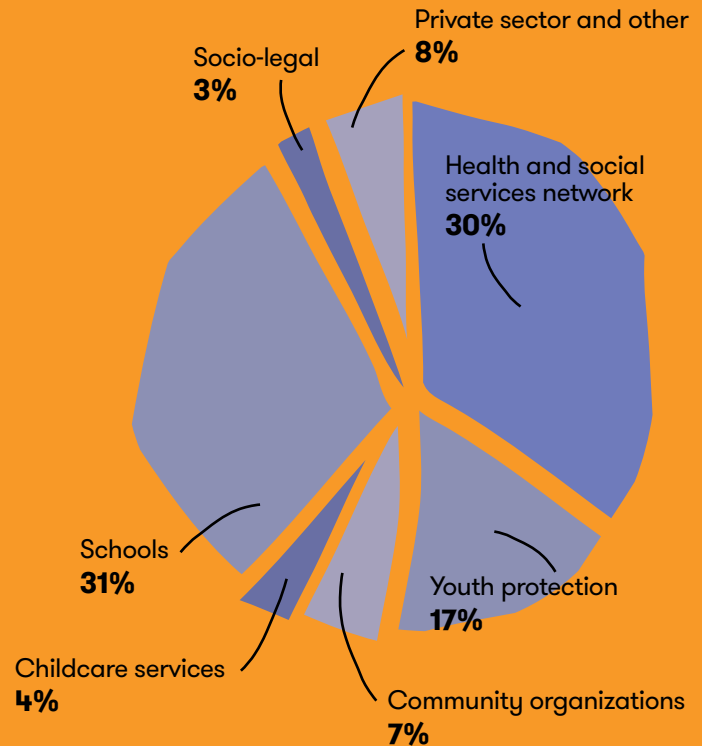

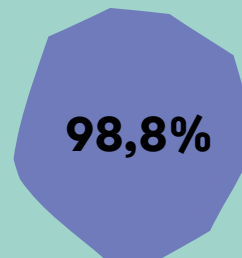

Results of the Lantern Program implementation

The Marie-Vincent Interuniversity Research Chair evaluated the first year of the implementation of the Lantern Program to prevent sexual violence towards young children. The results were conclusive: the program was well received both by childcare educators and by the children themselves.

Following the training, participants said they had gained:

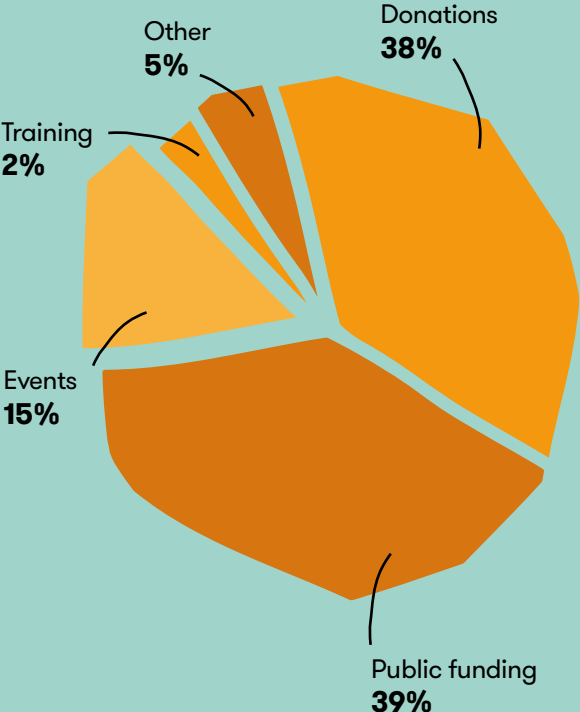
- **better awareness** of the vulnerability of young children to sexual violence.

- **a greater feeling of self-efficacy** in being able to prevent sexual violence and respond when necessary.

Early childcare providers also mentioned that the children are responded well to the tools and are asking for them again.

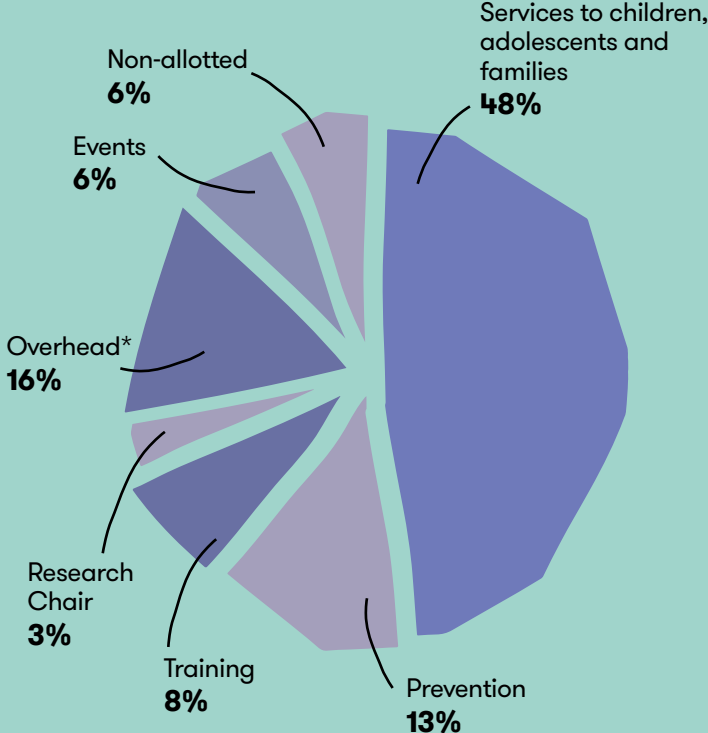

Portrait of a partner: the Pathy Family Foundation

What is the Pathy Family Foundation?

The Pathy Family Foundation is a family foundation based in Montreal. We support organizations that provide critical aid to meet basic human needs and that empower communities around the world to generate positive social change. PFF began with the germ of an idea and with limited resources. We decided to build a family foundation that would reflect our determination to help others less fortunate than ourselves, and that would allow us, as a family, to be proactive in doing so through organizations and people dedicated to the same values as ours.

Through our partners, we have, over the last 12 years participated in hundreds of projects in the areas of education, community-based health and social protection for eight different beneficiary groups in Canada and around the world. Although, the challenges faced by all of us in helping the most vulnerable people in our society are huge, we take satisfaction in knowing that in a small but impactful way, we have over these past years, made a positive difference in the lives of many.

How long as the Pathy Family Foundation been involved with the Marie-Vincent Foundation?

For the past ten years, PFF has a meaningful and diverse partnership with the Marie-Vincent Foundation, MVF. In 2010, our company employees began supporting the MVF's fundraising activities with regular donations. Since 2013, PFF has been providing multi-year grants to support services for sexually abused children and youth and their families.

What led you to get involved with the Marie-Vincent Foundation?

It was only natural for us to get involved with the MVF. Advancing child and youth protection efforts in Canada is one of our main priorities. As such, we had already invested in several programs to prevent sexual exploitation of youth and found that there was a marked shortage of resources and specialized services for these young victims.

When the MVF came to us with a project to develop specialised clinical services for adolescent victims of sexual violence and sexual exploitation, we were very eager to offer our support. It was exactly what we wanted to do: offer specialized therapy to teens and their families to help them recover. The MVF was the ideal partner to conduct this important work as they had developed a unique model of care for children devastated by sexual abuse. Now, four years later, many young people have received and benefitted from specialised clinical services adapted to their needs at the Marie-Vincent Foundation. Furthermore, they will also be able to access an interactive web application that is being developed to prevent youth sexual violence.

What is your greatest wish for the Marie-Vincent Foundation?

Our wish is that the Marie-Vincent Foundation continues to elevate youth and child protection work and to ensure that young victims can access the necessary support they need. We would encourage the MVF to expand all its services to reach more children and adolescents across the province and continue to foster collaboration and share their knowledge among all stakeholders invested in ending sexual violence and exploitation of our youth

What is your greatest wish for children?

Similarly, to the Marie-Vincent Foundation, our dream is to build a better world for all children - one where they have a chance to safely live their lives and reach their full potential.

Portrait of a partner: Christine Christie

What is your role with Montréal's police department (SPVM)?

I am the commander of the SPVM's sexual assault unit. I have 28 years of service during which I have mainly worked in the area of investigations. My role is primarily to oversee the investigations unit in charge of solving sexual assault crimes, whether committed against children or adults. To do this, we use different strategies and methods to solve these crimes, in close collaboration with various social and justice partners, so as to adequately support the victims and intervene among offenders.

How long has the SPVM been collaborating with Marie-Vincent?

The SPVM is proud to have been collaborating with Marie-Vincent since 2002. Over the years, we have been able to harmonize and improve our approaches and working strategies in order to provide services that adapt to the needs of the children and their families. Our collaboration has greatly helped to humanize our investigations and to refine our approach with this clientele.

How has this collaboration changed the work of investigators?

The collaboration with Marie-Vincent is unquestionably one of the keys to success in the investigations into child sexual assault cases. Most of our investigation interviews with children take place at the Marie-Vincent Foundation. The collaboration with the Expertise Centre and the access to adequately prepared rooms for the interviews greatly contribute to an atmosphere of trust between the child and the various professionals.

Creating such an atmosphere of trust with child victims of sexual assault is a great challenge. Having the children verbalize the sexual abuse they experienced is a very complex task for our investigators while preserving the legal survival of the case in the courts.

Training and updating knowledge are essential in having a positive impact on the children and adolescents. Marie-Vincent regularly supports the SPVM by providing professional development and working jointly with us through the process, enabling us to improve our interview techniques. For example, Marie-Vincent's experts support our investigators if needed when they have to conduct more complex interviews in delicate situations.

What is the impact of this collaboration on the children and adolescents?

The information obtained in the interviews also enables investigators and all other professionals to collaborate on the subsequent actions to take in the interest of the child.

It is very beneficial for these young victims, both children and adolescents, to have access to all services provided by Marie-Vincent's various professionals under one roof, in a collaborative, ongoing manner.

It should be noted that this collaboration with Marie-Vincent has enabled us to build relationships with various partners from the legal, social and health fields. We are able to discuss the various challenges that we each encounter and share best practices to better support the children and their families.

What is your greatest wish for Marie-Vincent?

Marie-Vincent plays a vital role for young victims of sexual assault and has unique expertise to help them. My greatest wish would be for the centre to be able to expand its services in future to all types of mistreatment committed towards children and teens. I also hope that the centre can continue its important mission for decades to come in collaboration with its different partners, including the SPVM.

What is your greatest wish for the children and adolescents?

In the hope of a better world for our youth, I dream of a society without any form of violence or mistreatment towards these children. For the girls and boys who are not that fortunate, may they find the strength and courage to report their perpetrators and always be able to count on professional support. Their well-being and safety depend on it.

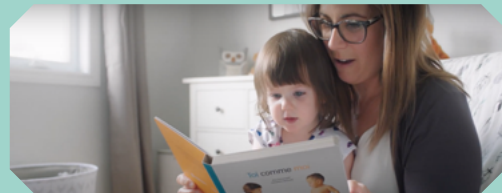
Preventing sexual violence against young children
