INTRODUCTION

Fifty years ago, Marie-Vincent began laying the groundwork for an organization that would become a leader in the prevention of sexual violence against youth. Half a century later, our commitment is as strong as ever and we look to the future with fresh determination, driven by our vision of a world without sexual violence.

This year we launched new prevention programs, rolled out a bilingual marketing campaign across all major media in Québec, and finalized a strategic plan for the next three years with a clear roadmap in place. We want to provide more inclusive, customized service, with a broader reach and a stronger position in Québec and Canada, and ensure our financial sustainability.

The urgency is real. The findings from a recent survey done in cooperation with our Research Chair are compelling. Nearly one woman out of three and one man out of five declare they were subjected to sexual assault before age 18, with the average age of the incidents being 11.5. Only half of the victims disclosed the assault and most of them did so when they were adults.

At Marie-Vincent, we believe that our youth must be protected and that it should be a priority for everyone.

That is why we are launching an ambitious three-year fundraising program with a target of \$15 million.

Together, let us lighten the burden carried by young victims of sexual violence.

MESSAGE FROM OUR SPOKESPERSON



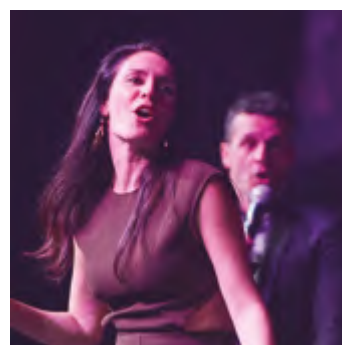

Together, these committees help make Marie-Vincent a healthy, engaged, and motivating workplace.



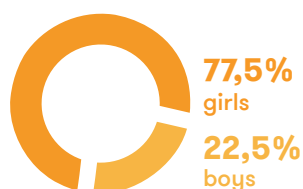

50TH ANNIVERSARY: A YEAR OF CELEBRATIONS



In 2025, Marie-Vincent marked a triple anniversary: 50 years for the Marie-Vincent Foundation; 20 years for its advisory centre; and 20 years for its Interuniversity Research Chair.

In collaboration with the Research Chair and the firm Synopsis, Marie-Vincent conducted a survey on the prevalence of sexual violence in Québec. The findings are striking: nearly one in three women and one man in five experienced at least one incident of sexual assault prior to age 18. The average age of the first assault is 11.5. Only 52% of victims disclosed the violence, and did so on average eight years after the fact, at the age of 19. And 78% never received any professional help.

All of the statistics can be found on our website.

Our anniversary was recognized at the National Assembly through two motions, tabled respectively by Justice Minister Simon Jolin-Barrette and Rosemont MNA Vincent Marissal. We inaugurated our Wall of Major Contributors and surpassed our goal of selling 500 promotional items. And lastly, we launched the campaign Easing the burden of sexual violence; the campaign images feature children carrying a heavy backpack to illustrate the invisible weight borne by these young victims.

OUR MODEL

Our clinical services, made available at our two centres (in Montréal and Châteauguay), serve the entire metropolitan area and the Montérégie region.

All Services Under One Roof

Through collaborations with partners, Marie-Vincent provides all necessary, trauma-sensitive services under a single roof: specialized psychosocial support and psychotherapy, family-oriented services, medical examinations, investigative police interviews, and guidance through the legal process. Integration of these services in a single location cuts down on the time spent by victims travelling from place to place and having to repeat their story multiple times; above all, this system ensures timely, coordinated and caring support for young victims of sexual violence, children under 12 presenting sexual behaviour problems, and their families.

A Leading Example



Marie-Vincent is a founding member of the Child and Youth Advocacy Centres across Canada (CYACC), a network of approximately 40 pan-Canadian organizations that coordinate efforts and share expertise for the benefit of young victims of sexual violence. The model, which enjoys worldwide recognition, is based on a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach focussed on the needs of youths and their families.

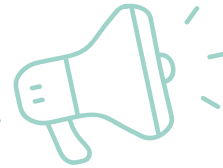

PREVENTION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS



The prevention and training teams at Marie-Vincent play a pivotal role in the prevention of sexual violence against young people. Each year, they reach thousands of professionals throughout Québec and lead numerous targeted projects designed to strengthen the protections of youths in everyday settings.

Training and prevention services are intended for professionals in the fields of education, early childhood education, health and social services, community organizations and the socio-judiciary sector.

This is how a genuine safety net is built – gradually, on a province-wide scale and beyond.

Training sessions use a variety of teaching approaches grounded in the latest scientific data.

Innovative Prevention Programs

Notable developments include two new programs that had their official launches in September 2025 at an evening event attended by a number of partners committed to the prevention of sexual violence.



Voies

Created for children ages 4 to 12 requiring special support, the Voies program features customized preventive content that considers the increased risk of sexual violence to this group. The training is dispensed in schools and in community, health and early childhood education settings. Its ongoing implementation is assured by secondary funding from Fondation Sandra et Alain Bouchard, which contributes to the development of new tools. The assessment report from the Marie-Vincent Chair is due in the summer of 2026.



Compass

A complete and fully bilingual prevention program, Compass is aimed at children and youths ages 6 to 12 and their families. It has been taught at children's camps and in recreational and community settings. A highlight of the year was its successful debut in New Brunswick.

The program was also presented to the practicing community of Knowledge Hub in Toronto. Its assessment by the Chair is also due in 2026, at some point in the spring.

Other projects that have made significant progress in the following months:



Halftime

Rolled out as a pilot project last year, Halftime was designed as a pilot project for school personnel (counsellors, phys-ed and health teachers, and sport coaches). It features an advanced module with guidance for facilitating workshops for students in secondary 1 and 2. During the 2025-2026 year, the team evaluated and fine-tuned the workshops and materials, developed and held training sessions, and create video clips for parents and families.

New funding from the Secrétariat à la jeunesse

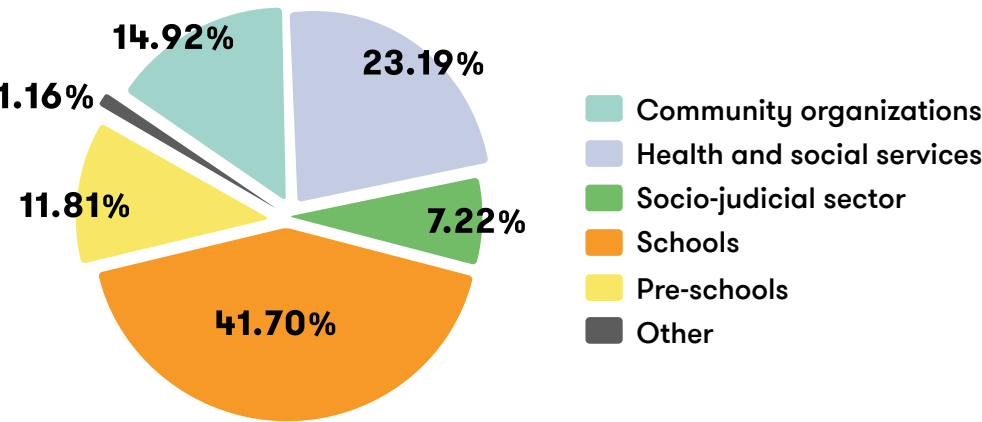
Marie-Vincent not only continued but upgraded its Heads or Tails program, which is aimed at youths 12 to 17 who are particularly at risk of sexual exploitation, and pursued the work on its sexual exploitation intervention kit. One of the year's highlights was the creation of a youth advisory committee—a promising project designed to ground Marie-Vincent's initiatives in young people's real experiences.



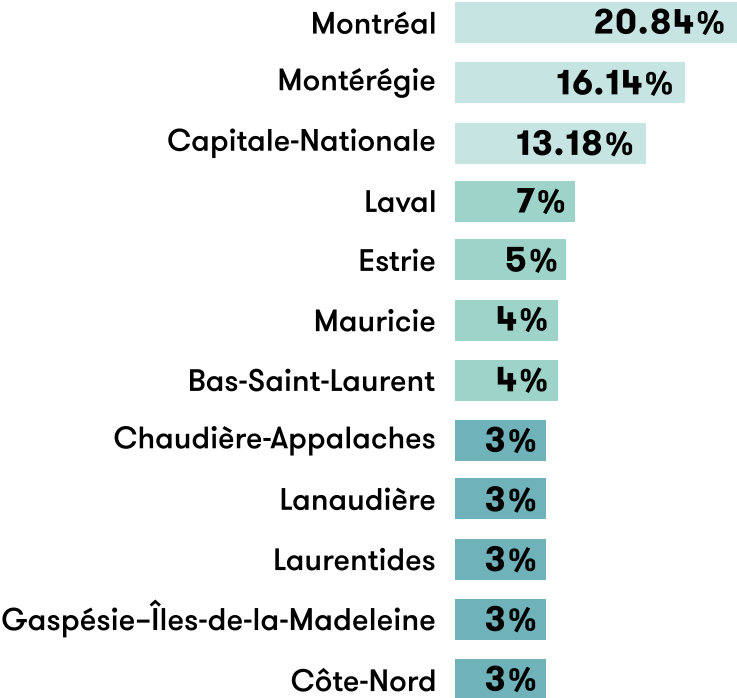
250 people gathered at the 2nd Marie-Vincent Symposium on the prevention of sexual violence among young people aged 0 to 17 (June 2025)

Hundreds of Training Sessions Throughout the Year

Between April 1, 2025, and March 31, 2026, the team held **330 training sessions** for **6,554 professionals** from all parts of Québec.

We also held **nine training sessions** in New Brunswick and managed two projects with Indigenous communities; a third is currently in progress.

Lantern Program for Home Daycares

From 2021 to June 2026, close to 2,400 home-based daycare providers throughout Québec received training for a project that ends in June 2026. Owing to this initiative, more than 24,000 children were reached, over 2,500 toolkits handed out, and some 15 early childhood prevention tools created or improved, then made available online in French and English.

With 233 training sessions dispensed in 17 regions of the province between 2021 and December 2025, this endeavour reflects a concrete commitment to preventing sexual violence from early childhood onward. Our warmest thanks go to the government **ministry for families (MFA)** as well as to the advisory group on continuing education and professional development for home based daycare providers for their trust and for helping turn this priority into real support for children and the adults in their lives.

A new training program for preschools

In partnership with Quebec's ministry of education (MEQ), Marie-Vincent developed teaching tools and a new three hour training, available in French and English, specifically designed for preschool groups. The content covers the psychosexual development of children ages 4 to 6, sexual behaviour problems, recommended intervention strategies, and steps to take in cases of disclosure or suspicion.

Renewal of Partnership With Santé Québec

Each year for the last decade or so, Marie-Vincent has offered free training to workers in the health and services network (RSSS) and two related community organizations. In 2025, the partnership with **Santé Québec** was renewed for a three-year period, during which training and advisory services will continue to be offered free of charge.

The available training covers 10 distinct themes in several formats (webinar, single-day, specialized content and online), thus reaching a wide array of professionals across the province. The diversity of formats has been met with a high satisfaction rate, confirmed by comments such as this by participants:

“ *Comprehensive content, and a very knowledgeable trainer who used good, relevant clinical examples. We liked the group formula, which led to substantive discussions.* ”

“ *The course is easy to follow. The content is relevant and useful in our daily work. Ideal length. Basically, I think everyone who works in schools should have this training!* ”

CLINICAL SERVICES FOR YOUTHS AND THEIR FAMILIES



Improved Service Access: Steadily Decreasing Wait Times

Access to our services continues to show steady and significant improvement. The average wait time for Marie-Vincent services has dropped from **16.5 months** (in 2022-2023) to **7 months** (in 2025-2026), pointing to the ongoing efforts to reach children and youths who need it the most, as promptly as possible. The intensity of support provided to each child depends on needs: on average, each case file requires **eight meetings** with services or parental support, **14 meetings** for a child receiving psychosocial services, and **19 meetings** for psychotherapy.

Areas of Expertise for a Diverse Client Base

In 2025-2026, Marie-Vincent provided **139** interpreted sessions, primarily in Spanish but also in Creole, Ukrainian and Bengali, for the parents of children receiving services.

This experience reflects the growing diversity of the clients we serve and our desire to provide services that are accessible to all, regardless of the spoken language. Furthermore, we handled **661** calls for advisory services from front-line professionals, thus extending our expertise beyond our walls.

Collaboration With Juripop: Combining Two Areas of Expertise

Thanks to a grant from the **ministère de la Justice du Québec (MJQ)**, Marie-Vincent collaborated with Juripop to strengthen clinical skills for professionals working with young victims navigating the judicial process.

Juripop, an organization that strives to ensure access to justice in the pursuit of a fair, equitable and inclusive society, dispensed fully customized training in November 2025. The training was also made available in an asynchronous format so new clinical staff can take it as needed.

Group Therapy For Victims of Sexual Violence

From October 2, 2025, to January 15, 2026, Marie-Vincent held a series of 14 group therapy sessions of 2.5 hours each for six young victims of sexual violence.

The project offered a space for open exchange and mutual support, and the experience proved to be very positive for all involved. The meetings were complemented by updates for families and end-of-service reports to describe outcomes and improve the group therapy process.



COLLABORATION WITH OUR RESEARCH CHAIR

Our Chair

In 2025, the Marie-Vincent Interuniversity Research Chair celebrated **20 years of collaboration** in the development of leading expertise in three complementary areas: prevention, screening and intervention for young victims of sexual violence and children presenting sexual behaviour problems.

The Chair's work directly informs the practices of Marie-Vincent at two levels. For one, it enables the clinical team to steadily improve its approaches to provide the support that best suits the needs of young victims and their families. Secondly, the Chair supports the prevention and training teams in the development of effective programs based on the latest evidence-based data. In so doing, the Chair's findings help broaden knowledge, contribute to the creation of specialized tools, and evaluate the delivered services.

Beyond its direct contribution to Marie-Vincent, the Chair plays a key role in training a highly qualified new generation of clinical and scientific professionals. Through its leadership, it actively contributes to the dissemination of knowledge in prevention and intervention, both nationally and internationally.

Marie-Vincent also wishes to acknowledge the invaluable contribution of the student body and the broader research community connected to the Chair.

2025-2026 REVIEW

A renewed mandate and notable collaborations

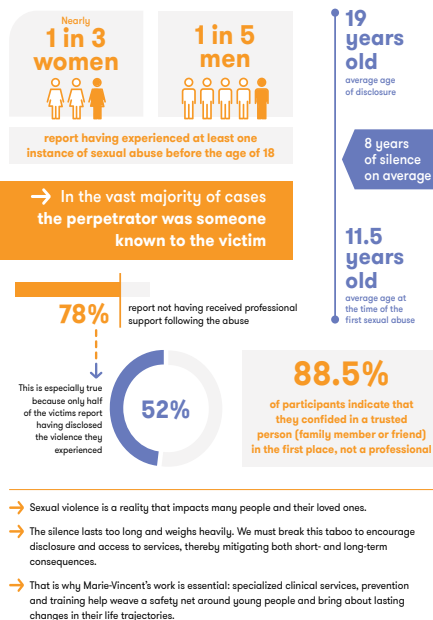
The year 2025–2026 was particularly significant for the Chair, whose mandate for the 2025–2030 period was confirmed. As part of Marie-Vincent's 50th anniversary, a large scale survey on the prevalence of sexual assault was conducted with a representative sample of the Québec population, replicating a study carried out 20 ago. The results will be used in a public relations campaign, scientific communications, and a symposium, including at CIFAS in June 2026. Marie-Vincent also welcomed Dr. Mylène Fernet as an associate researcher. A Full Professor with an established scientific track record, she has worked closely with Martine Hébert for several years. Her expertise in prevention of sexual violence among young people and adults—particularly in the context of intimate relationships—strengthens and enriches the Chair's research directions.

A dedicated new generation and concrete support for the teams

A total of 26 students were supervised by the Chair in 2024–2025, and eight of them completed their postdoctoral, doctoral, and master's programs over the past year. Their work dealt with a wide range of issues, from sexual behaviour problems to resilience factors, along with shame, revictimization, and the mental health of practitioners. The Chair also lent concrete support for several Marie-Vincent projects, among them the evaluation of the animal-assisted therapy pilot project, the Heads or Tails, Compass and Lantern programs, and an analysis of intake data. *Mercredis sucrés/salés*, a recurring event that fosters meaningful exchanges between researchers and front-line professionals, brought the group together eight times over the year.

SEXUAL VIOLENCE AGAINST YOUTH: A TROUBLING REALITY

This document presents the key points of the survey conducted by Synopsys from November 10 to 24, 2025, among 1,000 adults on behalf of Marie-Vincent and The Marie-Vincent Interuniversity Research Chair in Child Sexual Abuse. This survey aims to document, in the current context, the prevalence and consequences of childhood sexual violence among Quebecers.

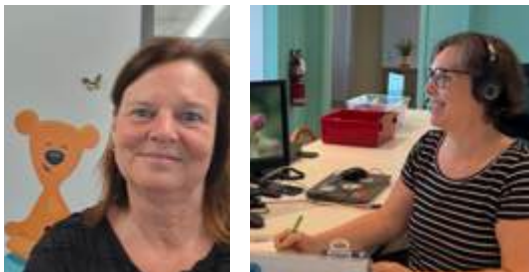


MISSION SUPPORT SERVICES

Alongside the clinical services and prevention/training teams, Mission Support services comprise all of the strategic and operational functions that ensure that Marie-Vincent runs smoothly on a daily basis: reception, finance, administration, information technologies and operations, communications and philanthropy. Each of these departments makes an essential contribution to the continuity, agility and visibility of our organization.

Reception

The reception team is the warm and caring preliminary contact that has greeted hundreds of young people, parents, professionals and partners at both Marie-Vincent centres over the past year, along with handling more than 7,000 incoming emails, dispatching the same quantity, answering more than 2,000 calls and managing innumerable little projects to embellish our premises.



IT and Operations

One of the year's milestones was a major advance in technology—the migration to a new Microsoft 365 productivity suite. With regard to online security, we worked to develop an information security and privacy policy as well as arranging training sessions and awareness and phishing-simulation campaigns for the staff. In the same vein, Marie-Vincent continued its work to comply with the requirements of Law 25 on the protection of personal information and launched an initiative on the responsible use of artificial intelligence.

Communications

This year, communications were instrumental in an array of big projects—coordination of 50th anniversary activities (including the major, bilingual marketing campaign) complete overhaul of the organization's website and simultaneous establishment of an intranet giving personnel a centralized space to access news and reference documents. The department also provided daily, active support to Marie-Vincent's teams and ensured communications for the year's major events (symposium, program launches, fundraisers, AGM) while maintaining its presence across mainstream and social media to promote the expertise, mission, teams and activities of Marie-Vincent.

Human Resources

In terms of recruitment and retention, a rewards program was rolled out and personnel benefits were expanded, most notable of these being the addition of a “working vacation” program. The annual survey revealed a positive work environment, with a good majority of employees expressing a strong feeling of belonging, accomplishment and well-being within the organization.

In terms of equity, diversity and inclusion, guiding principles were introduced to align internal practices with the organization’s values and to strengthen an inclusive culture.

Lastly, a number of initiatives supported staff health and well being: ergonomics training, peer learning sessions for managers, and support groups for the clinical, prevention, and training teams.

Finance and Administration

In 2025–2026, Marie-Vincent’s consolidated expenses exceeded \$10 million, a slight increase from \$9,139,457 the previous year. Seventy percent of these expenses were dedicated to compensating the professionals who enable the organization to carry out its mission.

Managing a budget of this scale represents a substantial workload for the Finance and Administration team, which ensures the sound and efficient management of the organization’s resources. The team also devoted significant effort to supporting the various departments in carrying out their projects, through increased collaboration on reporting requirements and the preparation of grant applications.

Philanthropic Development

The philanthropic development team is a crucial group that ensures the financial stability of Marie-Vincent and supports the implementation of its ongoing mission. Structured strategies are employed to educate, attract, and build donor loyalty, be they individuals, companies or foundations.

As this financial year ends, we kick off a major, three-year fundraising campaign with an ambitious target of 15 million dollars. This massive initiative is intended to strengthen Marie-Vincent’s long term capacity and increase its impact for young survivors of sexual violence and for society as a whole.

The department’s initiatives, the year’s events, and the outcomes are presented in more detail in the following section, “Your Contribution.”



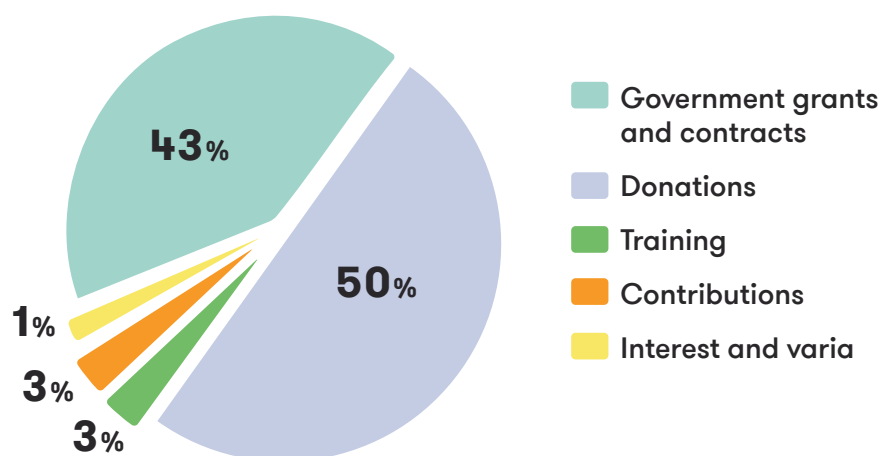


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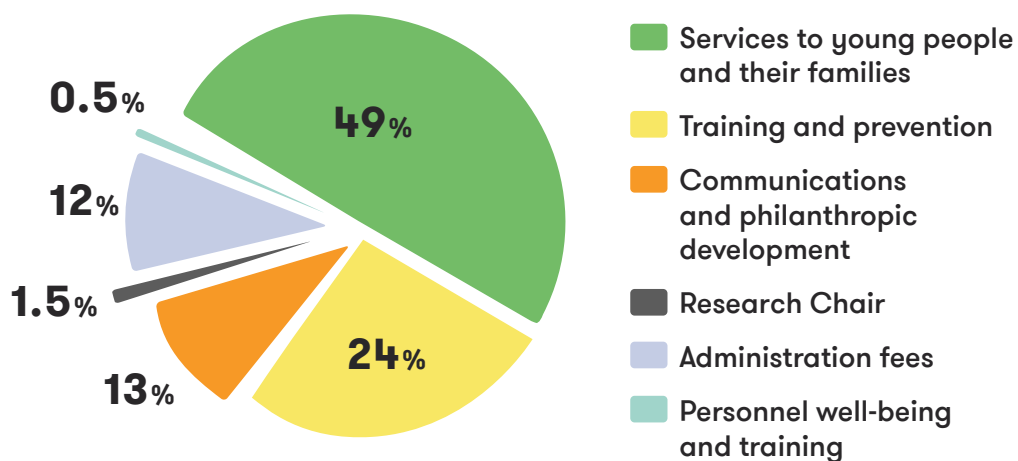

NEARLY \$570,000 RAISED BY MARVIN ON THE ROCK x OMBRÉ 2025

On November 20, 2025, at the Olympia Theatre in Montréal, Marie-Vincent Foundation held an exceptional edition of Marvin on the Rock, co-presented by **Fasken** and **MNP**, raising \$569,552 through the generosity of the nearly 500 guests in attendance.

Marvin on the Rock is a distinctive event where business leaders with no prior musical experience take the stage to deliver artistic performances in support of our cause. To mark the 50th anniversary of Marie-Vincent, this eighth edition of the talent show was teamed up for the first time with Ombre presented by **Croesus** — an event staged by Marvin's Circle, an initiative that attracts the support of young professionals.

The evening featured electrifying performances, moments of awareness raising, and a powerful testimony from Alison Green — founder of Bien chez Soi, member of our Board, and survivor of sexual violence. A tribute was also paid to Dominic Bécotte, co founder and managing partner of Amiral Ventures and founder of Marvin on the Rock, highlighting the more than \$2 million raised since the event's creation.

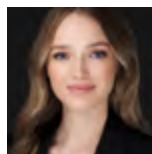

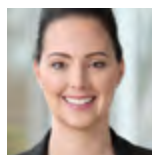
